
WE BELIEVE IN LEARNING BY DOING

As an accredited member of Polytechnics Canada, we deliver skills training with a purpose. Our students gain practical knowledge in a variety of settings including workplaces, medical clinics, simulation facilities, institutes, labs, shops, and studios.

Automation, artificial intelligence and climate change are just a few of the factors that are transforming the workforce. With new and disruptive technologies

developing faster than ever, employers tell us they're looking for a blend of technical and people skills in new hires—people who can problem solve, communicate effectively, and who are resilient in the face of change.

And where better to study than in state-of-the-art facilities like these:



1. The Chefs' House: At the only student-run, fine dining restaurant in downtown Toronto, students from our hospitality and culinary arts programs work in tandem to create, prepare and serve gourmet meals.

2. Child Care Centres: The college operates 12 lab school child care centres across Toronto that model the best practices we teach in our classrooms. These serve over 1,000 children and their families each year.

3. LED Media Wall: Work with industry-leading technology, video effects (VFX) and backgrounds, like those seen on the popular Star Wars spin-off series The Mandalorian, as well as Star Trek: Discovery, which is shot in Toronto.

4. Simulation Centre: We are the first college, nursing school, and simulation centre in Canada accredited by the Society for Simulation in Healthcare (SSH). This cutting-edge facility offers nearly 24,000 square feet of dedicated simulation space.

5. Orthotics & Prosthetics at Sunnybrook Hospital: Students learn how to design, fabricate and fit clients with braces and limbs to help restore mobility and body functionality.

6. WAVE Dental & Hearing Clinics: Our students provide clinical services to the public under the supervision of qualified professionals. Each year we treat over 3,400 clients for dental and hearing needs.

HOW TO APPLY

In Ontario, domestic students apply to all colleges through [OntarioColleges.ca](https://www.ontariocolleges.ca). You can apply for up to five programs through one application. Most programs at George Brown are eligible for early offers, which means depending on your date of application, you may hear back as early as **November 1**. For highly competitive programs, make sure you apply by **February 1, 2025** for equal consideration for an available space.

ACADEMIC CENTRES

CENTRE FOR ARTS, DESIGN AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

George Brown College's Centre for Arts, Design and Information Technology includes four schools: Computer Technology, Design, Fashion and Jewellery and Media and Performing Arts. The schools together offer 62 certificate, diploma and postgraduate programs, providing students the resources they need to turn their passions into meaningful careers in design, fashion, jewellery, drama, dance, theatre, filmmaking, digital experience, computer programming, game development and more. We partner with leading Toronto employers and cultural organizations including Rogers Media, Ubisoft, Microsoft, Oracle, IBM, Ballet Jörger, Soulpepper Theatre and Tarragon Theatre.



CENTRE FOR BUSINESS

Located at our St. James Campus, the Centre for Business is less than one kilometre away from Canada's economic hub in downtown Toronto. The centre includes four schools: Accounting and Finance, Human Resources, Management and Marketing. Our proximity to the financial district facilitates access to top employers for field education and networking opportunities. Many of our faculty are dual professionals who teach at the college while simultaneously working in the industry.

The Centre for Business regularly hosts networking events, symposia, awards and fireside chats to build exposure to current business leaders, trends and best practices. We are pleased to be one of two colleges in Ontario to have earned international recognition from the Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP). ACBSP has accredited 14 Centre for Business programs. Our programming is highly responsive to industry needs and we have recently launched innovative programs in supply chain, digital marketing, trades management, business analytics and advanced financial planning. We offer 46 business programs across the four schools.

CENTRE FOR COMMUNITY SERVICES AND EARLY CHILDHOOD

George Brown College's Centre for Community Services and Early Childhood includes three schools: Deaf and Deafblind Studies, Early Childhood, and Social and Community Services. The centre offers certificates, diplomas, degrees and postgraduate studies that will prepare students for a career doing important and meaningful work. From supporting marginalized and underserved populations, to working with community members across the lifespan, our graduates make an impact. The centre has partnerships with more than 750 agencies throughout the Greater Toronto Area.

We have Ontario's largest network of college-run child care facilities which serve over 1000 children and their families each year. We are proud to offer the Honours Bachelor of Interpretation (ASL – English) – the first degree of its kind in Canada, as well as the unique Assaulted Women's and Children's Counsellor/Advocated program (AWCCA).



CENTRE FOR CONSTRUCTION AND ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGIES

George Brown College's Centre for Construction and Engineering Technologies includes 36 programs across four schools: the Angelo DelZotto School of Construction Management, the School of Apprenticeship and Skilled Trades, the School of Architectural Studies and the School of Mechanical Engineering Technologies. The centre trains students to have the technical expertise and people skills to succeed in in-demand roles. Many of our programs such as the recently launched Power & Control and Precision Manufacturing programs

have been developed in consultation with industry. Students are trained in custom-built facilities to ensure familiarity with the standards and practices used in the real world. Our Industry Liaison Office provides crucial connections for work experience, events, and more. And the college's Green Building Centre and Brookfield Sustainability Institute are providing space for industry, faculty and students to work together to develop, test and implement sustainable building strategies and technologies.



CENTRE FOR HOSPITALITY AND CULINARY ARTS

George Brown College's Centre for Culinary Arts includes two schools: our Chef School, and the School of Management and Hospitality. The centre offers 24 certificate, diploma, degree and postgraduate programs. The school is located in the heart of downtown Toronto, steps away from the city's top restaurants, bars, hotels and event venues. Our students enjoy state-of-the-art facilities, including customized baking, culinary and mixology labs and work experience in the college's fully functional, fine dining restaurant, The Chefs' House.

The centre regularly hosts a who's who of culinary and hospitality talent, including global chefs such as Nigella Lawson, Gordon Ramsay and Alain Ducasse and notable alumni Mark MacEwan, Jamie Kennedy, Bonnie Stern and Roger Mooking. In 2023, we were pleased to become the first chef school in Canada to achieve the Gold Organic Campus Designation from the Canada Organic Trade Association.



CENTRE FOR HEALTH SCIENCES

George Brown College's Centre for Health Sciences includes four schools: the School of Dental Health, the School of Health and Wellness, the School of Health Services Management and the Sally Horsfall Eaton School of Nursing. The centre offers 29 certificate, diploma, degree and postgraduate programs. Our Bachelor of Science in Nursing is a collaborative nursing degree program offered between George Brown College, Centennial College and Toronto Metropolitan University.



The Centre for Preparatory & Liberal Studies acts as a vital bridge for students wishing to gain English language skills or foundational knowledge in health, business, arts or science. The centre has three schools: the School of English as a Second Language (ESL), the School of Liberal Arts & Sciences, and the School of Work & College Preparation and is also home to the Department of English and Communications.

For over 30 years, we have provided support for newcomers to Canada as well as domestic and international students looking to grow their skills for future study or career opportunities. We offer a welcoming and supportive environment for a diverse range of learners, including those facing barriers to academic or employment success. Whether you are just starting out, looking to transition to employment or ready to start over, we have a program for you.

Students across the college receive English & communications instruction from the Department of English and Communications. Our School of ESL is the largest public provider of English language training in Ontario. We offer a wide range of program pathways to help students reach their academic and professional goals at George Brown or one of our many partners in the Ontario college system.


Finances shouldn't be a barrier to receiving an education. At George Brown College, we have resources that can help you pay for college, and our Financial Aid team is here to provide support.


George Brown has three campuses located in downtown Toronto (Casa Loma, St. James and Waterfront) as well as The George, our student residence.


