Prime Ministers of Canada and Barbados Visit George Brown College for Student Sustainability Town Hall

On October 19, George Brown College welcomed Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and Prime Minister of Barbados, Mia Mottley, co-chairs of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals Advocates group, as well as MP Marci len, Minister for Women and Gender Equality and Youth, to participate in a town hall discussion with students on Canada-Caribbean international relations and how to build a more sustainable world.



GBC Hosts Ontario Government Announcement for \$300M in PSW Recruitment Funding

On November 23, George Brown College hosted Ontario's Minister of Long-Term Care Stan Cho and Minister of Health Sylvia Jones to announce up to \$25,400 in funding per individual, for PSW students and recent grads. The ministers were accompanied by 4 GBC PSW students, Miranda Ferrier from the Ontario PSW Association and Marketa Evans from Colleges Ontario. Delegates wrapped up the day with a tour of our nursing and dental schools.



Federal Environment Minister Makes EV Announcement at George Brown College

On December 19, Canada's Minister of Environment and Climate Change, Steven Guilbeault, visited the Waterfront Campus to learn about our Electric Vehicle Technician program and announce new federal EV regulations. He was accompanied by 7 federal colleagues, industry and media representatives.



George Brown College Acquires Corus Quay in Waterfront Campus Expansion

As a key component of facilitating the acquisition of 25 Dockside Drive, the GR Unit managed to secure the required Ontario Government Section 28 approval within a record-breaking 10 weeks due to solid relationships with key government members. This approval process can typically take up to 9 months.

Blue Ribbon Panel: Working with partners to provide solutions for financial stability in postsecondary education.

In March 2023, the Ontario government created a blueribbon panel to provide advice on the financial stability of post-secondary education. Over the past few months George Brown College has participated in the blueribbon panel to discuss and provide solutions in response to the challenging landscape of post-secondary tuition. The panel delivered its report of recommendations to the Ministry of Colleges and Universities in November addressing tuition and how to better align education with labour market needs.

Investigating solutions for post-secondary affordable housing for staff and students.

Colleges play a critical role in supplying the highly skilled workforce to support growing labour market demands across the province. Ontario's lack of student housing affordability and supply is a critical challenge that if left unaddressed, will have longterm implications for the social and economic development of the province. As an urban Ontario institution, with all 3 campuses located in Toronto. GBC has positioned itself to be a leader in exploring housing opportunities rooted in student success in Canada's most expensive city. George Brown College's recently published Housing Taskforce - Progress Report and Initial Findings documents the pressing demand for student housing solutions. The study found that existing government funding programs for affordable housing do not consider student residences as an eligible type of housing and there are no additional funding sources available to acquire or build new student residences.

Advocating for expanded transit options through the East Waterfront LRT.

The Union Station to Queens Quay Link and the East Bayfront Light Rail Transit line, also known as the Waterfront East LRT (WELRT), is a priority Waterfront Transit Network project and a joint effort involving the City of Toronto, the TTC, and Waterfront Toronto. On November 7, George Brown and Waterfront Toronto hosted a boat tour with Toronto Mayor Olivia Chow, other city officials, and key waterfront stakeholders to learn about the college's contributions to the community and the need for efficient transit. The event highlighted why investing in the proposed WELRT line is essential to connect new and existing educational, business, and residential developments to meet continued growth in the area. Shortly after, Toronto City Council members approved the expansion of this new line.


Government Relations

Strategy 2024

It is through this annual report that we are pleased to announce the completion of our first Government Relations Strategy: A framework for addressing strategic priorities in future months and years.

This strategy was built after several months of consultation internally, externally, and as a result of several diverse teams collaborating to identify goals and objectives that align with our future college vision.

Broadly speaking, the strategy provides a framework to guide decision making on advocacy, tours and events, and how we allocate our energy and resources. Further, it recommends developing internal systems to share critical information internally and externally, and takes a whole-of-institution approach to interactions with government. It is a guidebook for continuing to build our GR Unit as a shared services resource, ultimately to best support the work of faculty and staff.


